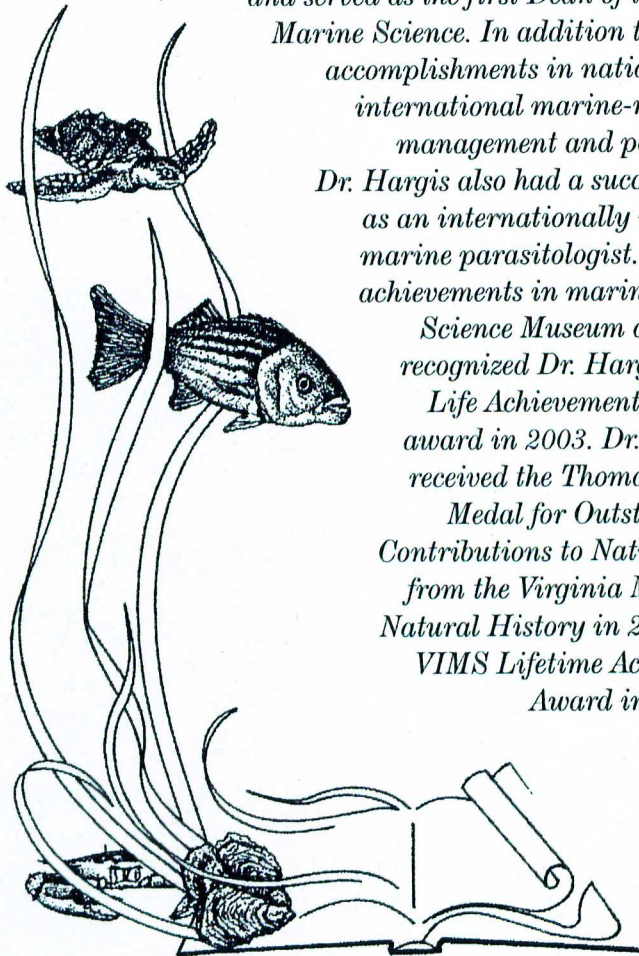

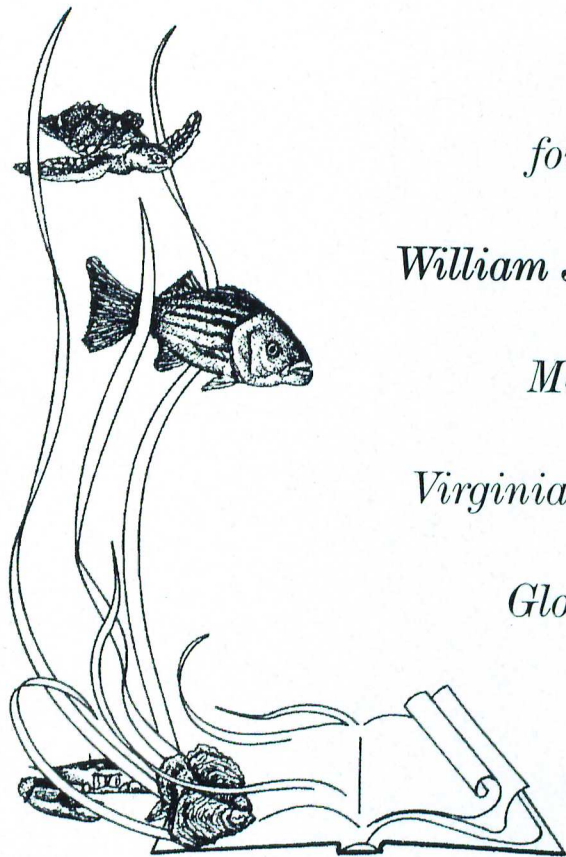
William Jennings Hargis, Jr.

Dr. William Jennings Hargis, Jr., led VIMS from 1959 to 1981, longer than any other director. He was responsible for transforming the institute from the Virginia Fisheries Laboratory to the Virginia Institute of Marine Science, and served as the first Dean of the School of Marine Science. In addition to his many accomplishments in national and international marine-resource management and policy, Dr. Hargis also had a successful career as an internationally renowned marine parasitologist. For all his achievements in marine science, the Science Museum of Virginia recognized Dr. Hargis with their Life Achievement in Science award in 2003. Dr. Hargis also received the Thomas Jefferson Medal for Outstanding Contributions to Natural Science from the Virginia Museum of Natural History in 2003, and the VIMS Lifetime Achievement Award in 2004.
